The All Wars Memorial located in Danville, California is a project undertaken by the Viet Nam Veterans of Diablo Valley and continued by the All Wars Memorial Foundation. The Memorial is unique in three ways. As the name implies, it honors those who perished or served in all wars, past and future. Second, it recognizes the sacrifices of the families of those who served. Lastly, it pays tribute to all patriotic Americans, who in their own way supported, contributed, volunteered and sacrificed to assist those fighting in a conflict.

Memorial Design

The **All Wars Memorial** is located at Oak Hill Park in Danville, CA on Stone Valley Road, next to Monte Vista High School. The Memorial is nestled in a bowl perfectly suited for the memorial. It is visible to the public and easy to reach, yet provides a place for solitude. It includes a spiral remembrance path, and a stone wall with five bronze Liberty Panels leading to the healing space. From the healing space, a spectacular view overlooks the park lake and onto Mt. Diablo in the distance. There is a large statue of two soldiers, one wounded with the other helping him to the healing space above. Rolf Kriken, who did the bronze work at the California Viet Nam Veterans Memorial in Sacramento, sculpted the statue. The statue speaks to the many issues of service, sacrifice, pain, heroism, loyalty, camaraderie and hope.



Site Dedication

On Veterans Day 2004, the statue, path, stone wall, and Freedom Wall were dedicated. Two of five Liberty Panels, and 1,100 granite pavers were installed and dedicated on Memorial Day 2005. The remainder of the Memorial is slated for final dedication on Memorial Day 2006.



The Freedom Wall has quotes engraved in granite delivering the message that freedom is not free and that every generation is called upon in the constant struggle for freedom. The five Liberty Panels are depicting historically significant events from the Revolutionary War up to today. The path along the wall has pavers inserted in the middle allowing the opportunity to recognize the sacrifices made by individuals, organizations or military units.

The 8-inch square granite pavers cost \$250.00. They are engraved to honor individuals, units or organizations that have sacrificed for our freedom. This memorial is unique in that it is designed to not only recognize those who have sacrificed in the past and present but those in the future as well.

Fund Raising

You can forever honor and have remembered those that have sacrificed to assure our freedom by purchasing a paver. Individuals



that qualify for a paver are any person who served honorably in the military at anytime. They need not have served in battle or during time of war. Because of the expanded recognition of the All Wars Memorial, you can honor the widow who raised a family alone, the child who grew up without a parent lost in war, the parents who lost a child, the sibling who lost a brother or sister, the fiancé left waiting, the spouse of service people overseas and to all patriotic Americans who in their own way supported, contributed, volunteered and sacrificed to assist those in our military. All of these patriots may be forever honored and recognized through these memorial pavers.
